The Hearst Foundation will pay the expenses for attendees and applicants must be holding a leadership position in one of the following organizations: Student Council (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer, Representative), Class Leadership (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer), or National Honor Society officer. Two delegates and two alternates will be chosen from each state. Students chosen for the program who attend "Washington Week" will be awarded a \$10,000 college scholarship for their undergraduate education. Senior Year Checklist:



- Every effort should be made to take the ACT by October!
- Consider registering for the TN Promise.
- Apply to all the colleges you are considering, paying special attention to all deadlines and requirements for admissions and scholarships. Every effort should be made to apply by November 1st.
- Keep detailed notes in Naviance tracking your application and scholarship deadlines.
- Read Weekly Newsletter.
- Males over age 18 must register with the Selective Service at www.sss.gov
- Parents and students need to apply for a FAFSA FSA ID and the FAFSA for federal grants, loans, work study, and the Hope Scholarship.
- Once scholarship and financial aid information has been received, have a serious family discussion about what you can afford in regards to your education.
- Pay all required enrollment and housing fees (if applicable) by the deadlines.
- Obtain an after-school/summer job to learn money management and help contribute to your college fund.
- Consider a summer internship related to the career path in which you are interested.
- Watch social media accounts. Colleges have rescinded admissions and scholarship offers in response to students posting inappropriate and/or defamatory material

Come and see Mrs. Jauregui in the Guidance office for more information and help on your specific needs. You should apply to as many secondary scholarships as possible! A good rule of thumb is 1 per day!

AXA Achievers scholarship application beginning in September. Applicants must be U.S citizens/legal residents demonstrating strong academic/extracurricular/community achievement, drive, and determination. The awards will range from \$2500-\$25000 and more information can be found at <https://us.axa.com/axa-foundation/AXA-achievement-scholarship.html>

Tennessee Hope Lottery Scholarship- available to students planning to attend a two or four year college in Tennessee who have earned at least a 3.0 GPA (listed as Hope GPA on the BHS transcript) or an ACT composite of 21. Must apply through the FAFSA website at www.fafsa.ed.gov and indicate a Tennessee college or university as your child's first choice on the application. Students attending a four year school will earn \$1750/semester (\$2250/semester if a 3.0 GPA is maintained as a freshman and sophomore college student) and those attending a two year school will earn \$1500/semester. Tennessee Promise Last-Dollar Scholarship- available to students planning to attend a two year Tennessee community college or Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT). There is no minimum GPA requirement to apply, but students maintain a 2.0 GPA and complete 8 hours of community service each semester. Students must apply online between August 1-November 1, 2018 at www.tnpromise.gov They will have to sign up for an account, log in to the account, and apply for the program. Tennessee Promise communicates with students primarily through email (including confirmation their application has been received), so students need to check their email frequently. Families must complete the FAFSA by Friday, February 1, 2019 in order for students to remain eligible for the program.

FastWeb is a great website to find unique scholarships. Students complete an application and based on their answers, FastWeb will email opportunities to them. Go to www.fastweb.com for more information.

Coca-Cola is offering 150 \$20,000 scholarships to students who show strong academic promise and a history of involvement/leadership at school and within the community. Go to <https://www.coca-colascholarsfoundation.org/> for more information and the application. Deadline is October 31, 2018.

Updates

Are you applying for at least 1 scholarship per day? If not, someone else is...\$ is out there but you have to be diligent.

-Get creative in your thinking for scholarship funds!

~Does your college offer an alumni scholarship for students of parents who attended the school?

- ~Are you a first-generation college student? Some colleges offer special programs for these students!
- ~FedEx is partnering with the University of Memphis to assist hub workers in obtaining a degree. Students can consider working in the hub to potentially earn their college degree through an online program tuition-free. Go to uofmglobal.memphis.edu/LiFE for more information.
- ~Do you know what you want to major in or do for a career? Check each college's policy for freshman student departmental scholarships!
- ~Check with your church, employer, and/or community groups to see if scholarships are offered for children of members or employees.
- ~BEWARE- scholarship scams are out there! If it sounds too good to be true or you are being asked to pay money for assistance with a scholarship search, it is not legitimate! However I recommend the scholarship app Scholly!
